Nautical flags, or signal flags, are an internationally understood method for vessel communication. Depending on the context, each flag has a specific meaning. With language and cultural differences, this form of communication is unambiguous and effective. Most often the flag meaning rather than its letter is the key message as spelled-out words are less clear.

	Third substitute	Substitute for the third flag in this hoist.
